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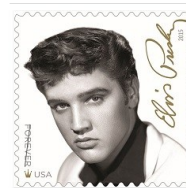

From the Editor

I've been wondering about what percentage of the pictures in this publication are linked to philatelic versus non-philatelic webpages. (New online reader? Click on almost any picture to take you to a related site.)

But how related to stamp collecting are these hyperlinks? Advertiser clicks are obvious; they're sent to a dealer's website. Also predictable are the organizational logos at top of page 1 and the Wiscopex ad at the bottom. I try to make the non-collecting sites educational or entertaining.

So, for last quarter, I did an "analysis." (I counted and did simple math.) Last quarter showed a split of 39 links philatelic (76%) and only 12 (24%) not. This issue was about the same, 38 to 20 (66% to 34%).

Is USPS strict about early release of new postage stamps? Yes!

Harold Davis did not receive his package of 4¢ Angel's Trumpet definitives until January 14, five days after it was issued in Kenosha. Davis was the one who photographed the flowers. He also created the images for the 1¢, 2¢, 3¢, 5¢ and 10¢ stamps in that series.

The one-cent denomination has a single tulip. The two-center shows two daffodils, and so forth. The 10¢ design, though, has a mixed bouquet of six poppies and four cone-flowers.

Airmail Arrow Excavated

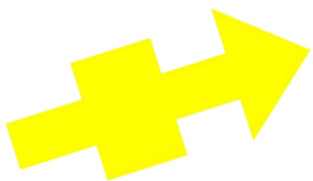
On October 21, the Eden Historical Society announced that excavation has begun on what might be Wisconsin's first documented beacon station arrow,* recently discovered on private property, surrounded by farm fields.

The yellow-painted concrete arrows, up to 70 feet long, were installed from 1926 to 1932 next to beacon towers as navigation aids to early airmail pilots.

ATA #5 is trying a new approach to resolve the age-old problem of planning the club's evening programs. At the December meeting, each attending member was given three small slips of paper and were requested to write one program idea on each slip. The ideas could range from some basics of the hobby to topics. A drawing was held and the meeting topic for January was Cranes—with the instruction to also include non-bird cranes such as those found used in the building industry or as a surname.



Bob Mather, having been involved with the International Crane Foundation, gave an informative talk with a handout.

Although cranes as a bird was the predominant theme, there were several who brought stamps showing the crane as a tool in industry. Two members

also thought to include Ichabod Crane. A Reader's Theater activity gave members a reading opportunity in the retelling of the Washington Irving tale of "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow".

The "hand picked" February program for ATA #5 is butterflies. And as February is often associated with Presidents, the group will also be viewing two new PowerPoint programs developed by member Aimée Devine. The first is titled "Commander in Chief Challenge" and it will be followed by "Presidential Nicknames." Later, members are invited to contribute interesting trivia about former presidents and/or sharing presidential philatelic items.

The Waukesha County Philatelic Society recently received two donations. The material is being offered to members in a special donation auction at their February meeting. A "Grab and Run" program show-and-tell asks members to imagine that some type of major disaster such as fire, flood, tornado, etc. is about to affect their collection and that they have time to quickly grab only one item from their collection. Members will share that item and explain



what significance that item has and why they chose to "save" it.

The Milwaukee Philatelic Society is honoring Bob Mather at their February meeting. Collectors have been invited to help in this celebration by sharing stories and memories. Arrangements have also been made to include Zoom presentations by those unable to attend in person. Do you have a person in your club that has made significant contributions to the club? Perhaps it is time to honor them at one of your meetings.

The Badger Stamp Club annually prepares a card listing their programs and club activities for the year. It is printed out and distributed to the members. They also recently received a large donation of a worldwide mixture for members to poke through.

The Northwoods Philatelic Society had an informative talk about Christmas Seals by Milt Wirth. Its January meeting featured an interesting auction item—a 1936



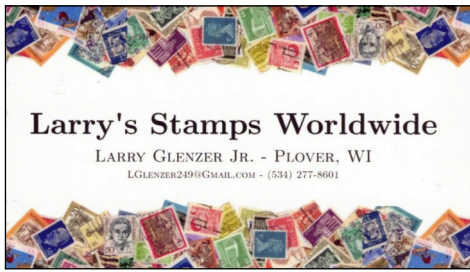
Olympic postcard. Held in Berlin, the front side of the card

depicted the stadium entrance and the Hindenburg flyover. The back side of the card had an Olympic cancel from the opening ceremony. Mark Pleyte was kind enough to submit a copy of both the front and the back of the card

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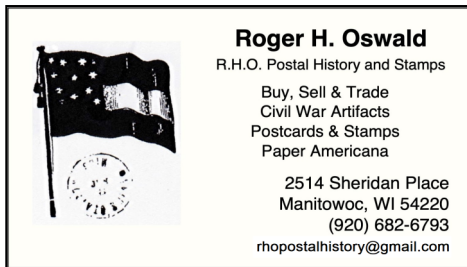
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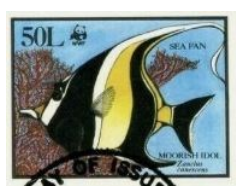

Soak, Sort and Store Stamps by Rich Regent, Wauwatosa Philatelic Society

What advice can we give a stamp collector who has a bag of 10,000 stamps—a huge backlog of unsorted stamps just bought at a stamp show? A helpful plan is definitely needed to organize the stamps, yet save time, be productive, and reduce harmful repetitive motion. First, separate stamps into three containers: 1. water-soluble-glue on paper, 2. self-adhesive on paper and 3. off-paper stamps.

Soak off the water-soluble glue from on-paper stamps and place them face down on paper grocery bags to dry. Now is an obvious time to easily find and remove damaged stamps to be used for art projects, perfins, and even United Kingdom graphite-lined stamps.

Remove self-adhesive on paper stamps from their paper as described elsewhere. Eventually, the bag of stamps is now all off-paper and in one container. Stamp collecting has become fun and less overwhelming. Next, divide this mixture of worldwide off-paper stamps into two groups: United States and



foreign stamps.

To sort stamps, have good lighting, a comfortable chair, magnifying glass, stamp tongs and plenty of table surface area. Set aside unidentifiable stamps for later research or for a worldwide mystery sale. Containers with open tops are preferred, rather than constantly turning clumsy stock pages during the initial sort which slows the process. Try handy plastic compartment storage boxes, bins, small tubs, or dishes, normally used to organize and store small parts. Save those empty cottage cheese and sour cream containers. One second is all that is needed to identify and toss a stamp into the correctly labeled container.

Now, sort the United States stamps. Separate the Christmas, transportation series, 1938 Presidential, mint no gum, precancel, perfin, block and numbered coil stamps into containers. The rest are effortlessly sorted into two groups by general sizes: small and large (including medium) stamps. The small stamps go into a container, duplicate books or for online sales in sets by topic or theme. The large stamps are further sorted into dishes labeled in cents: 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 13, 15, 18, 20, 22, 25, 29, 32 and greater than 32. Denominations which don't match go into the next lower cent container. Sorting can also include groups or types of mail service, such as airmail, Special Delivery, Postage Due, cut squares, Parcel Post or revenue stamps.

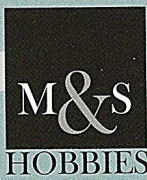

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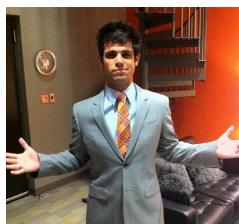

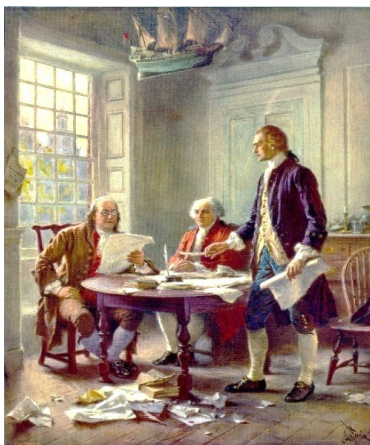
