AMERICAN FIRST DAY COVER SOCIETY will present a certificate for the best exhibit featuring first day covers (U.S. or foreign).

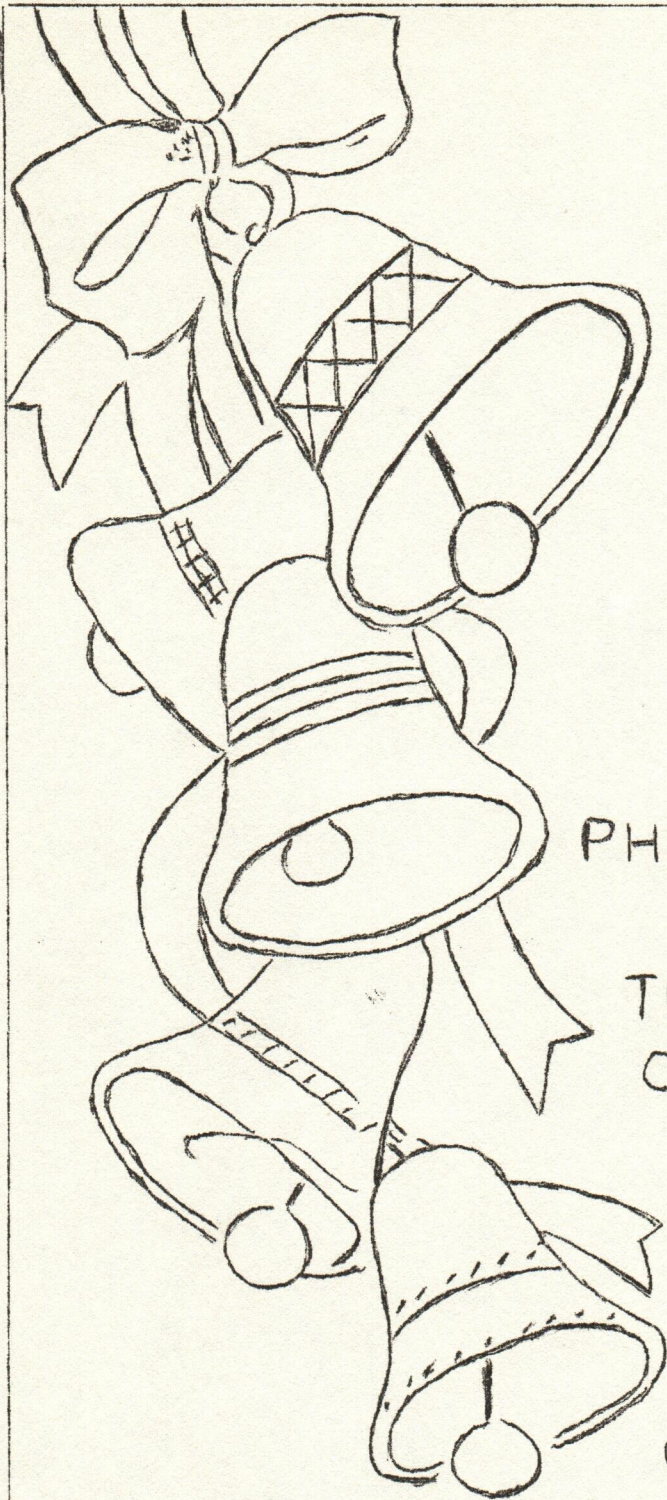
AMERICAN TOPICAL ASSOCIATION will present a certificate for the best topical exhibit.

U.S. CANCELLATION CLUB will present a certificate for the best in cancellations.

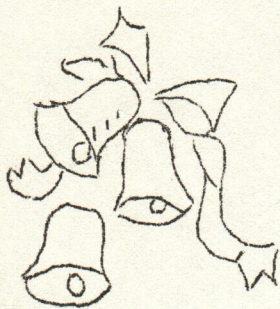
In addition to the above awards designated for particular phases of collecting, both the American Philatelic Society and the Society of Philatelic Americans will donate awards.

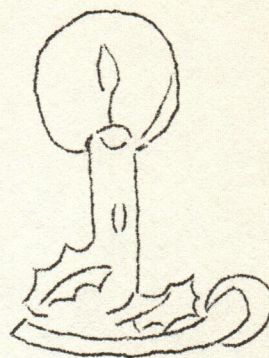

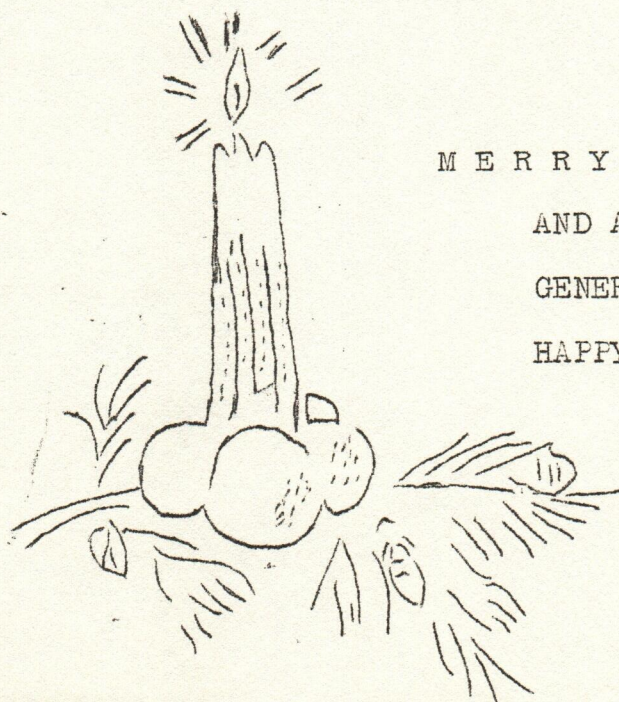
