

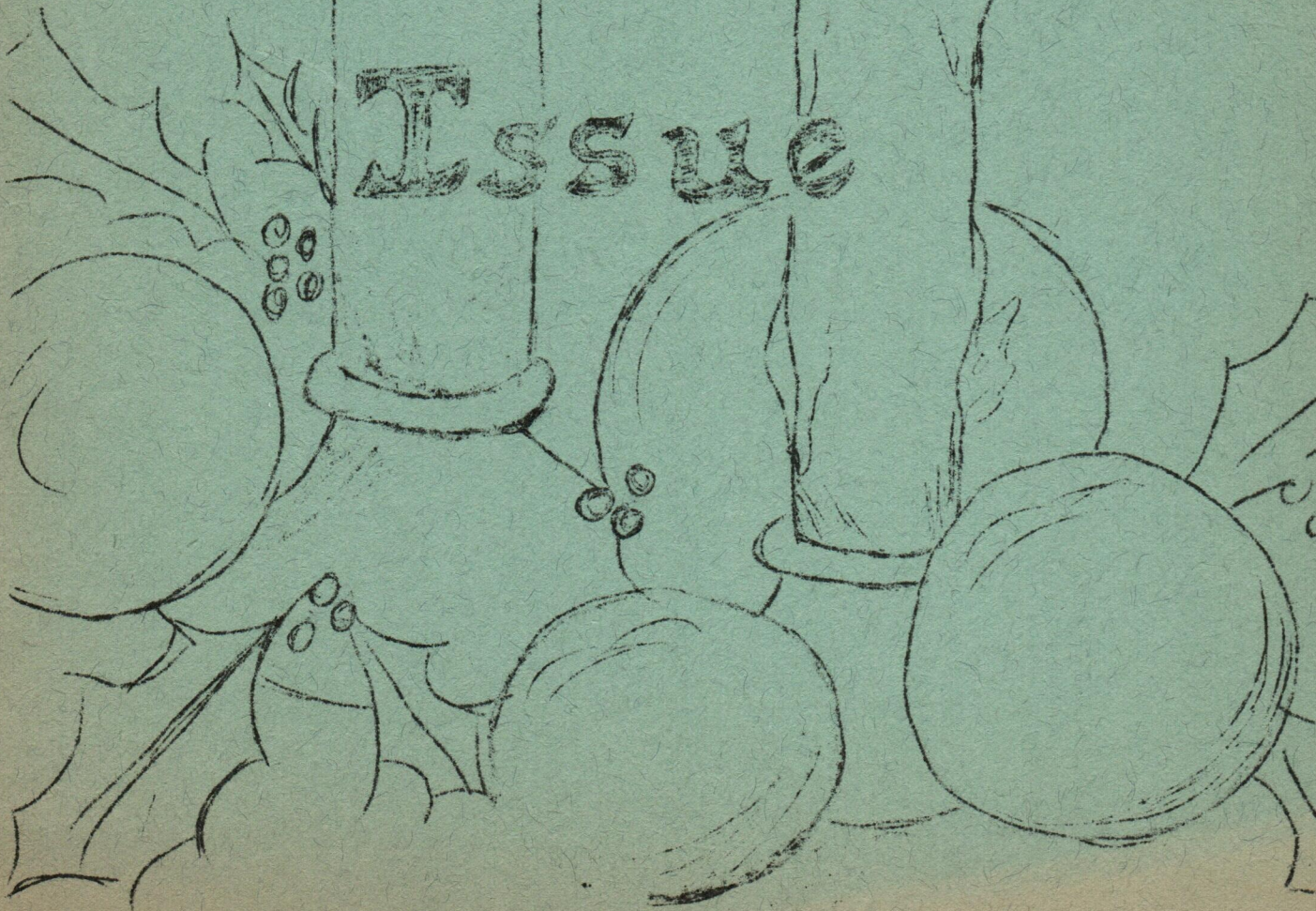

WISCONSIN POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY

KING BEAL DIES

From Waterloo, Iowa, comes word of the death July 18th, of King Beal, founder and secretary of the Cover Collector's Circuit Club, a cooperative organization of cover enthusiasts which had some 60,000 members at the time of its founder's passing.

Mr. Beal had been a dominant figure in the field of cover collecting since the 1930's. He took a particular interest in cacheted covers and conceived the idea of selecting the best of each year's cachets. Older collectors will recall these annual King of Cachets competition.

Feb. 8th---Movie (color) ISRAEL, A STAMP IS BORN.

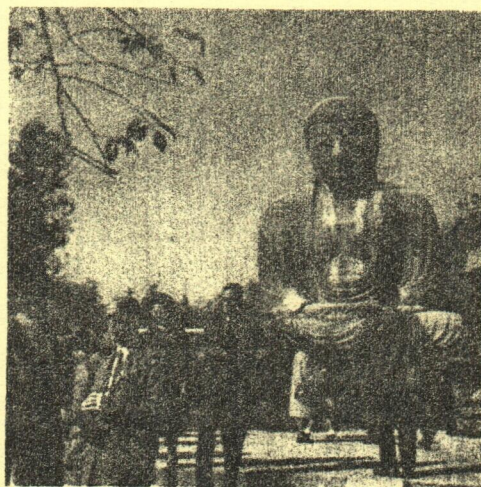

Stamp collections often represent a life time of care and devotion. Certainly they are not built in the course of a single lunch hour. However, this is the time which was required to obtain the material used to illustrate this article.

On this and the following page are suggested how a series of topical collections might be made, using various travel folders as the theme.

Here, material from a Japan Travel Bureau folder has been combined with Japanese stamps. In this way many of the interesting places one hopes to visit someday can be enjoyed today through postage stamps of the world.

Every travel bureau, and air line office has similar folders. All are not limited to one county. Most are delightfully illustrated in full color.

On the next page, Heraldry rather than scenery is used as the theme. This basic material comes from an Air France Booklet. Air France, it seems, names their jets after famous Chateaux. The Chateaux have heraldic shields or blazons. The various political subdivisions of France also have blazons. France, over a period of years has issued sets of stamps showing these shields. Combining these various factors could result in days, weeks or months of interesting research---many pages of material---much pleasure and added knowledge.

CHATEAUX IN THE SKY



Chateau de Sully-sur-Loire



SULLY-SUR-LOIRE is a Gothic masterpiece surrounded by a moat. A 14th century feudal chateau, its 500-year-old wooden tower is in a state of perfect preservation, and attests to the superb French artisanship of the day.

Sully-sur-Loire is noted in history as the meeting place of Joan of Arc and Charles VII. This chateau on the banks of the Loire also served as the estate of Duke Maximilian of Sully, and finally as Voltaire's place of exile during the Regency. The great hall of the chateau's dungeon has the finest medieval timbering left in all of France.

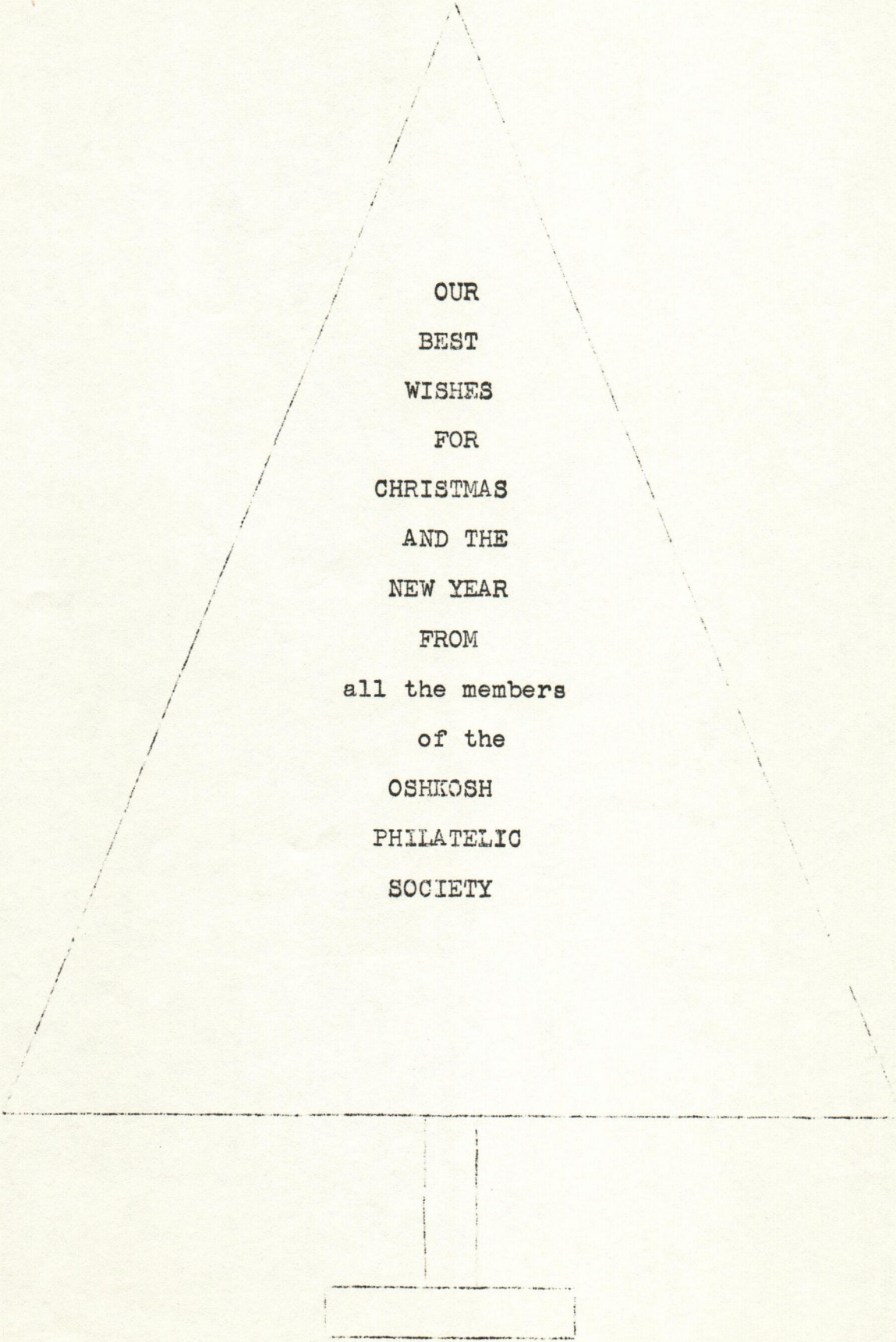

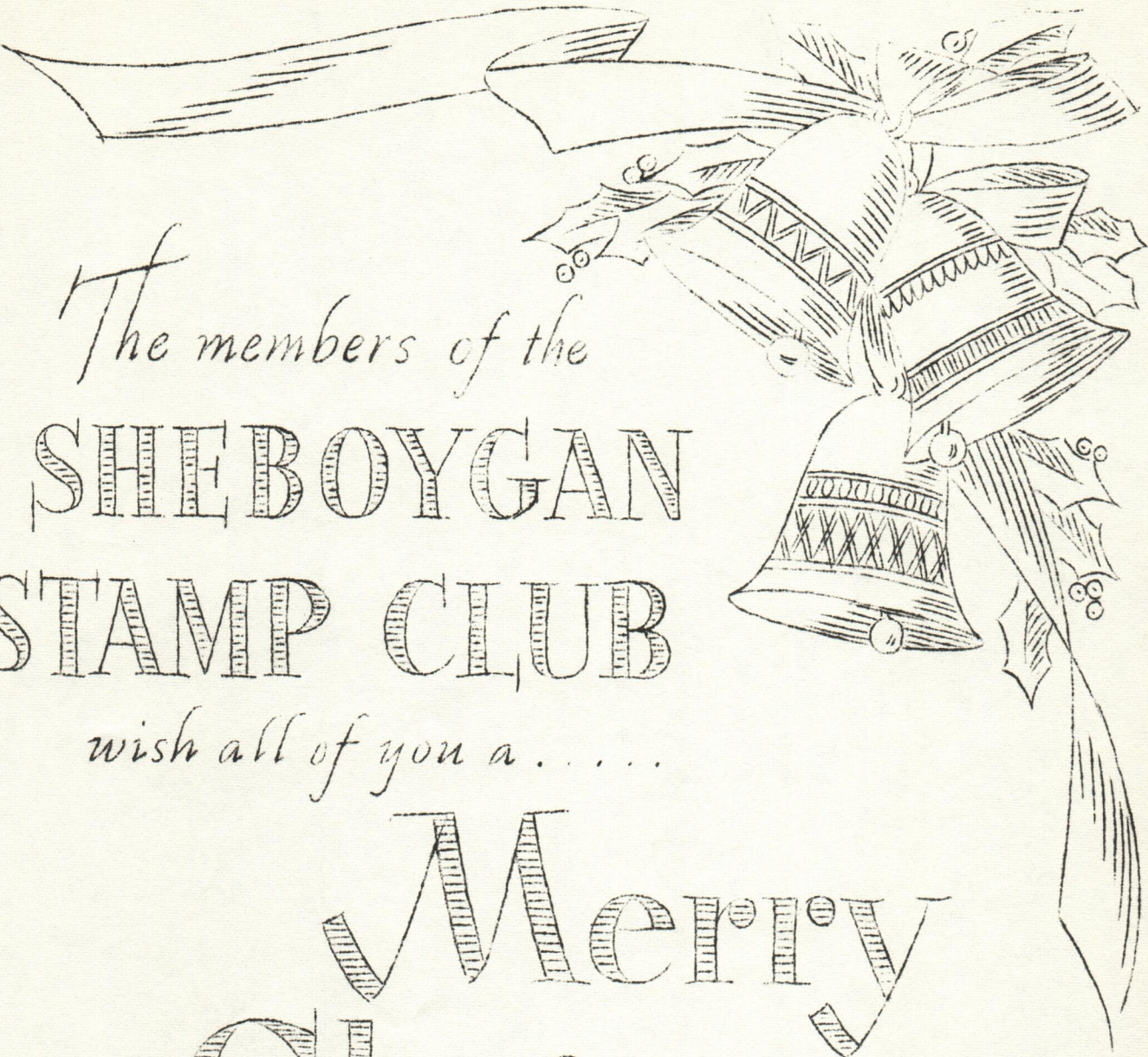
