

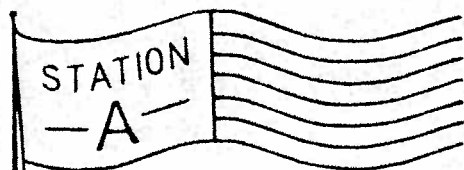




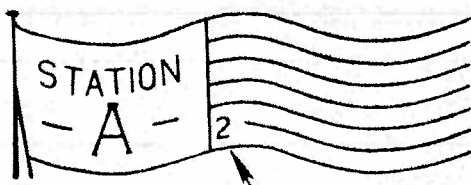


# American Postal Machines Co. Impressions

## AMF7A



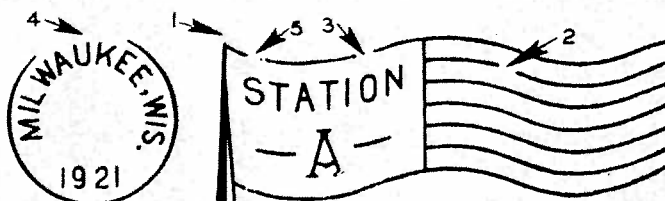
During the first years that this machine was used in Milwaukee, two types of flags were used on the machine, and the differences can be noted by the position of the large "A" in relation to the "A" of "STATION".



NOTE: Use of die number space in the lower right hand corner of the flag box. One would imagine that, due to the sequence of year usage, the same die was machined and number inserted. However, with closer examination the difference in the "A"s will be noted.

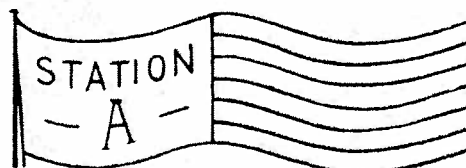
## Doremus-American Impressions
