This new exhibiting category is specifically set up to tell the story of the year 1932, the year of the founding of the Wisconsin Federation of Stamp Clubs. Any aspect of that year may be shown through stamps, covers, and other philatelic material. 1932 material from a specific country or continent is suggested. If selecting an event from 1932 such as the Olympics or the birth or death of some famous person or in trying to tell a 1932 story in a topical/thematic way, then non-1932 material may be used.

Each entry is one 8-1/2" x 11" vertical paper which must be in a sheet protector. The name and mailing address of the exhibitor must be included on the back, inside the sheet protector. The exhibit should have a title, a story, and at least one philatelic element. Depth of research and quality/selection of material is important. Creativity encouraged – a unique idea, first vs. third person, humor, presentation (mounting, layout, paper, fonts), etc.

Entry fee is \$.75 plus \$.25 for WFSC celebration fund for total of \$1 per page. Exhibit fee must accompany the entry form. Entry form must be received by April 15, 2007. Exhibits may be brought to Wiscopex 2007 or mailed to MaryAnn Bowman, P.O. Box 1451, Waukesha, WI 53187, and received by May 1, 2007. Return of entries may be by personal or club representative pick-up after the show or by mail provided that return postage is included. Clubs and individuals may combine exhibit entries in one mailing to save costs.

Each entry will receive a gift and will be part of the Award's Ceremony. More than one entry per exhibitor is allowed.
